


MONTHLY CLUB MEETING

Are You Prepared?

If you live in a disaster-prone area, you can take certain steps before disaster strikes to help ensure the safety and well-being of your pets.

Responsible dog owners should have certain supplies on hand year round in case of an emergency evacuation due to disaster. Keeping these supplies packed together in a convenient location will be helpful if you and your loved ones need to evacuate.

The American Kennel Club® recommends the following supplies:

- Leash and collar with ID tags attached
- Medical health records including a current vaccination record and rabies tag
- Photocopy of AKC® registration papers
- Recent photo of your pet
- At least a three-day supply of food, medication and water
- Food and water dishes
- Blankets or bedding
- Crate
- Favorite toys
- Plastic "pick-up" bags

The American Kennel Club also recommends permanent identification for your dog, such as a microchip or tattoo and enrollment in the AKC Companion Animal Recovery database. Keep this identification information with your other pet emergency supplies.

Permanent identification will help reunite owners and their dogs and is especially important in a disasterprone area.

Have You "Winterized" Your Dog?

Cold weather brings its own safety and health concerns for both people and dogs. As a responsible dog owner, it is important to pay attention to your dog's well-being during the winter. Remember the following precautions to help keep your pet comfortable, healthy, and safe all season.

Provide Plenty of Fresh Water. Your dog is just as likely to get dehydrated in the winter as in the summer. Snow is not a satisfactory substitute for water.

Provide Plenty of Food. Feed your dog additional calories if it spends a lot of time outdoors or is a working animal. It takes more energy in the winter to keep body temperature regulated, so additional calories are necessary.

Keep Your Dog's Paws Dry. Rinse your dog's feet and dry them completely after a walk. This helps avoid tiny cuts and cracked pads. A little petroleum jelly may soften the pads and prevent further cracking.

Groom Your Dog Regularly. Your dog needs a well-groomed coat to keep properly insulated. Towel or blow-dry your dog if it gets wet from rain or snow.

Keep Your Dog Warm, Dry, and Away From Drafts. Adequate shelter is a necessity. Tiles and uncarpeted areas may become extremely cold. Place blankets and pads on floors in these areas.

Watch Out for Winter Hazards. Cold: Don't leave your dog outside for long periods of time. Wind chill makes days colder than actual temperature readings, and dogs are susceptible to frostbite on their ears, tails, and feet.

Ice and Snow: Be extra careful when walking or playing with your dog outside. Your dog could slip or jump in a frozen lake, river, or pond and get seriously injured. Snow can muffle scents, and your dog can easily get lost.

Carbon Monoxide: Don't leave your dog alone in a car. It gets too cold, and carbon monoxide from an engine left running is dangerous.

Antifreeze: Although it smells and tastes good to your dog, antifreeze is highly poisonous and can be lethal.
