

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

The AKC grand Champion program provides an opportunity for labs who have finished their champion-ships to continue competing. The AKC put forth the program in 2009 to allow dogs that had completed their championships to continue competing, to increase the entries at local clubs and to allow potential breeders to see finished champions, To obtain a Grand championship a finished Lab has to obtain a total of 25 points from the breed ring, which it can do by winning the breed, being best of opposite sex or by being select dog or select bitch. (The awarding of Select dog or bitch is totally at the discretion of the Judge.) Three of these ribbons must be at majors. They must be awarded by three different judges and one other judge must award points. Your lab must also defeat a champion of record three different times.

Over 90 per cent of registered dogs retire from the show ring when they obtain their championships. Labradors have other fun things to do – obedience, agility, hunt tests field trials, and the like but if you are not involved in these, your Lab does not have to sit home until there is a veterans' class. There is no charge for this competition (but you do get charged for entering the breed.)

There are various different levels of Grand Championship achievement. Once you have obtained your Grand Championship you get a bronze for 100 points, silver for two hundred points, gold for 400 hundred points and platinum for 800 and above. At present, there are no platinum, two gold and 12 silver level Labradors according to the AKC.

This is a worthwhile and fun endeavor for your finished champions and if you have not thought about it you might want to give it a try. You can compete as often as you like.

On a totally unrelated note, we will be having a talk about exercise induced collapse at our next meeting as part of the events we require to hold our specialty. Please plan to attend if you can and we will be updating the show progress. Hope to see you there.

JUNE CLUB MEETING


OUR NEXT MEETING WILL BE HELD ON JUNE 18th
