# PRESIDENT'SLETTER

September 2012

This year has seemed to go very quickly. It is almost time for the October specialty and supported entry. Thanks to our Officers and Directors for their help and to all our members for their support over the past year. We will have our annual meeting Saturday 30 minutes after the Best of Breed competition at the show site. Please plan to attend if you can.

On a different note, we have passed a resolution at our last meeting to adopt the LRC's position on "dilute" gene Labradors and to have it posted on our website. The LRC's position is posted on their website in an article by Fran Smith, DVM, entitled Another "Designer" Dog.

Doctor Smith concludes that it is the position of the LRC that the "silver" Labrador is not a purebred dog. (These colors seem to also include by implication the "champagne", and "charcoal" Labradors.) Her conclusion is based on the impossibility of the dilute gene in coat color of black or chocolate in purebred Labradors. Variations is yellow coat do not depend on any dilute gene but rather on modifiers of the yellow gene.

Doctor Smith says that the public is being "duped" into thinking that they are buying a purebred, rare, and desirable animal commanding a premium price. She also notes that the AKC has registered some "silver" labs apparently under the rationale that the silver coat is some shade of chocolate. (Dr. Smith states that the original breeders of "silver" labs were involved with Weimaraner, the breed that carries the dilute gene. She states that it might not show up for several generations of breeding) Lately, we have seen and heard warnings from breeders concerning websites advertising champion Labradors in Designer colors.

This "dilute" coat question creates a problem for us as breeders of the only recognized colors (black, yellow and chocolate) in several ways. The marketing of these designer dogs as purebred for a premium price when they are not recognized by our parent club or us as purebred is troubling. The AKC registering these dogs as purebred when the LRC says they are not is equally troubling. (Apparently they have been registered as black or chocolate.) Owners (and maybe breeders) of these dogs who have purchased them with AKC registration and a "dilute" color must be equally frustrated now by a decision that says their "purebred" dogs are not purebred and therefore their coat color would be a disqualification in a conformation show.

I requested a clarification from the AKC on how these designer dogs could be registered if not purebred or if they were in fact purebred or why would our parent club determine they were not. I have not heard back and don't really expect to.

This is not just elitism by the LRC. The LRC determines the standard for Labradors including what is acceptable as coat color. They have determined that it is black, yellow and chocolate only.

The AKC may have registered these dogs in the mistaken belief that they were traditional yellow, black or chocolate, without any knowledge of their coat color except a check marked box.

The owners of these dogs may have thought with good reason that as being registered they were purebred Labradors.

Friends, what we have here is a good old fashioned mess.

It is hard for us as breeders to advocate the LRC standard that there are only three recognized coat colors in purebred Labradors, when the AKC, the body responsible for registration of purebred dogs, is registering as purebred dogs with other coat colors. Having now adopted the position of our Parent club, we could assist the LRC in identifying the Labradors which are nonconforming and unacceptable to them as purebred. The LRC should then deliver those identified to the AKC and demand it to withdraw their registration as purebred, then prevent the registration of their get.

My best guess is that none of that is going to happen, so just tell everyone you know that the LRC does not recognize any other color but black, yellow and chocolate in pure bred labs.

# ACTIVITIES REPORT

#### **GALRC Activities**

The GALRC participated in a Responsible Dog Ownership Day (RDO) on September 8 at Wills Park in Alpharetta, GA.

Sponsored by the Atlanta Kennel Club and the Combined Specialty Clubs of Atlanta, this fun day for dog owners and potential purebred dog owners included an AKC conformation match, handling classes, Junior Showmanship classes, CGC testing, and education booths by the specialty clubs.

We didn't have a "booth" or even a table, but my old girl Gracie and I made the rounds of the grounds and spoke to several visitors. Gracie, in true Labrador fashion, gave lots of licks and received belly rubs. More than one person asked about her coat (a true double coat), and I launched into discussions about the acceptable coat colors.

I sent a thank you note to the coordinator, Darcy Quinlan with the Atlanta Kennel Club, and offered our club members' expertise on future education programs. We hope to have a table with Labrador retriever pamphlets and other educational materials at the RDO Day next year.

This satisfies one of the AKC requirements for education programs for the GALRC.

As an aside, sadly, our Gracie made her way to the Rainbow Bridge two days later, on Monday, Sept. 10, 2012. She was almost 13 years old. She was Kisatchie Grace The Cover CD RE ASCA-CD and retired therapy dog extraordinaire.

The Georgia Canine Coalition will meet in October. Several Georgia legislative bills are being watched, in particular items that were held over from the 2012 session. The Coalition is watching changes to the Dangerous Dog Bill, state cruelty laws, and the continuing saga of the vet, groomer, and trainer tax.

One suggestion is a day at The Canine Ranch in Waleska, Georgia (about 30 minutes north of Atlanta), where we could picnic, jump the dogs off the facility's competition dock diving pool, run agility or rally, or learn introductory nosework or tracking.

# TEMPERAMENT TEST

#### **EQUIPMENT TO BRING**

- · A six foot lead and slip collar is required
- · Chai
- Bags to clean up after your dog

#### **TEST DETAILS**

- Test is limited to 45 dogs
- Bitches in heat may take the test but will be run at the end of the day, after all other dogs have been tested.
- Dogs must be a minimum of 18 months of age
- ATTS is open to ALL breeds of dogs. Mixed breeds may take the test, but are ineligible to be certified unless they are spayed/neutered
- Dogs that pass the ATTS test may add the title "TT" after their names, and will be issued a certificate and number from ATTS
- No refunds will be given for entered dogs that do not take or complete the test
- Testing order will be scheduled the day of the test on a first come, first served basis.
- Two walk throughs of the ATTS course will be conducted one at 9:00 AM and one at 1:00 PM
- Entries must be on the official ATTS entry form and must be on one sheet of paper, copied front/back
- No preparation or training beyond normal socialization and exposure to normal living is necessary
- In the event of rain, testing will still be conducted
